Dear Bishops, Archdeacons, Clergy and Pastors,


RE: ARCHBISHOP'S MESSAGE

Greetings in the most precious and mighty name of Jesus, our Lord and Saviour.

As you are well aware, the Movement Control Order (MCO) is extended to 14th of April and inevitably affected all regular church services including the Holy Week Services (Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter).

After discussion with the Provincial House of Bishops and our Diocesan Senior Leaders, I have made the following decisions: -

- 1. All respective dioceses will decide their own Holy Week Services arrangement according to their local context and constraints.
- 2. For Diocese of Sabah, please adhere to the following: -
 - Due to MCO and geographical constraints especially in our Central Archdeaconry, there will be no services and no Holy Communion in all our Churches during the Holy Week. No Holy Communion also applies to worship services held at homes. I am aware that there are churches doing 'Online Consecration' of the Holy Communion. We can discuss about this when we meet as clergy and pastors body once things back to normal. But for now, my instruction on Holy Communion during Holy Week stands.
 - 2. We encourage every family to worship at your own respective homes.
 - 3. Churches may arrange their own Holy Week Services via online or live streaming for their members.
 - 4. Live Streaming and Recordings will be made available through Facebook, YouTube for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter. Churches may download these sermons and incorporate them in your own respective online or live-stream services.
- 3. We encourage all to continue to pray for God's gracious intervention to end the spread of Covid-19 pandemic and a vaccine for this coronavirus to be found.
